THE CUSTOM OF THE CHRISTMAS WAFER

Christmas is a time of family traditions and customs. Often at this time I reminisce about the past and remember how our family would always gather at Grandma's house on Christmas Eve to celebrate the vigil with the traditional Polish meal known as WIGILIA. Various family members prepared nine different dishes. Because of the strict fasting regulations at that time, all of the dishes were meatless. The nine entrees represented the nine months of Mary's pregnancy.

As the time of the meal approached, everyone would gather around the table for the customary sharing of the OPLATEK, the Polish Christmas Wafer. Grandma, affectionately known as "Busia," would take the Oplatek and reverently break off a piece and pass it on to the next family member with a prayer and a good wish. We would wish each other a "Merry Christmas" and exchange a hug or a kiss. This family ceremony lasted a few minutes, but the memories of the loved exchanged lasted a lifetime. Afterwards, we would sit down and enjoy our meal.

This Christmas custom is an old one. Perhaps you would like to make this a tradition in your family. Again, this year the Christmas Wafers are

What should we do?

We are half way through Advent, preparing for the birth of Christ—not in the literal sense, for he was born over two thousand years ago, but in the metaphorical sense. How might we allow him to be born anew in us? We, too, ask what should we do—and we are reminded by John the Baptist to do what parents and grand-parents, godparents, guardians and caring adults do best: teach your children to share with others, to care about others, and to strive to be fair and just in all that you do. Advent is a good time to ask ourselves how well we are doing at teaching these things.

28th ANNUAL ST. AIDAN ADULT CHOIR CONCERT

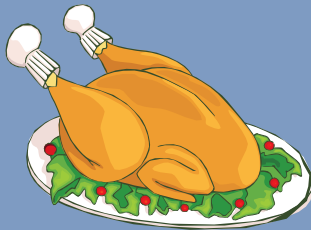

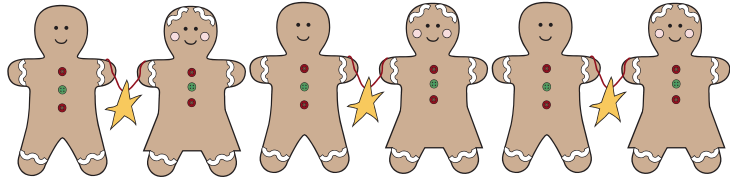

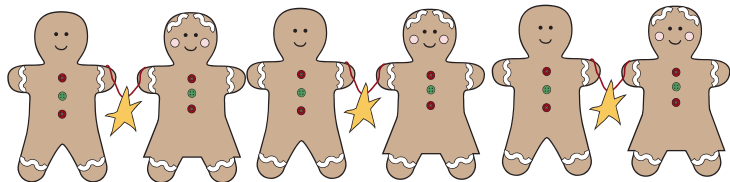
