BELCZAK'S BULLETIN

The checkout clerk looked at you kind of funny. "You've got something on your forehead," she said, unaware of Ash Wednesday. We spent the date with a mixture of pride and embarrassment. We are proud to be Catholic, but we are a little uneasy about appearing in public wearing such a strange sign. Some think the ashes mark the righteous, those who go to church. But in reality it expresses our need for repentance. Jesus calls those who need the mercy and compassion of God so that the life-changing power of forgiveness might be experienced. Lent is a time for us to become familiar with that saving power.



Lent is a time of conversion leading to new life – a new life brought about by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and our sharing in them through baptism. Traditionally, Lent was – and remains – a summons to renew and live out the baptismal life. So take time this Lent to remember baptism. Serve water at the table. Display some flowers in clear water. Bless yourself with water when you pray the Sign of the Cross. If you happen to have a baptismal candle, use it to light your celebration. Give thanks for the gift of baptism. Be sure to pray for our catechumens and elect who are preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

Recommit yourself to your Lenten resolutions. No matter what you decided to do, remember that the season is long, and that sometimes we might need to begin again. Be sensible. Be specific. Set a good example for those around you. Don't act gloomy or glum. Instead, be a sign of hope. You are not on the way to the dentist – you are on the way to Easter!

Remember, Lent doesn't signal a 40-day cessation of celebration. It simply signals celebration in a new key. When you share meals, for example, you can still share them in joy, even if those meals are of simpler fare. Plan how to use the money saved by simpler eating. Ask yourself: "With whom will I share the money that I save?" Finally, as you travel the Lenten journey, keep your eyes open to the springtime things that are beginning to happen all around. Look and look again. Recognize each day the meaning of God's activity that is taking place around in so many "ordinary" ways!

DO YOU HAVE A PYX THAT YOU ARE NOT USING?

A Pyx is a small container used to protect the consecrated bread when bringing communion to a person who cannot attend Mass with the community. We normally have about 6 to 12 of these containers available for parishioners to use for this purpose. If you have a pyx at your home or in a coat pocket and no longer have need for it – we encourage you to return it to the parish office or to the sacristy in the weeks ahead. Thanking you in advance for your cooperation in this matter.

RETURN YOUR PALM BRANCHES

Each year we request that you return last year's palm branches to the church. These branches are burned to create the ash that is imposed on our forehead on Ash Wednesday. We also use the old palm branches for the Easter Vigil fire. Please place your palm branches in the basket located in the Gathering Space in the weeks ahead.

CSA UPDATE: GOOD NEWS!

Earlier this month, we received the following note from David Smith, Director of Accounting Services for the Archdiocese of Detroit. It read: *"Your parish has received a refund for CSA 2009 of \$27,112.16 for the quarter ending December 31, 2009. This amount has been transferred to your deposit account as of January 11, 2010."*

You may recall that we use the CSA as a once-a-year opportunity to support our parish "over and above" our usual Sunday Stewardship of donations dropped into the offertory kiosk. All monies generated over our mandatory target are automatically returned to our parish and deposited into our Capital Savings Account to be used for future capital expenditures. Last May, 824 individuals or families supported the CSA, helping us to reach and exceed our mandatory target.

I want to thank all who so generously supported our 2009 CSA. **Each time you fulfill your monthly or quarterly pledge you are actually giving your financial support to Saint Kenneth Parish.** If everyone continues to complete their pledge through March 2010, our parish will benefit from an additional \$23,714 of "tax-free" revenue. Unlike all other donations given to our parish, money generated through the CSA is not subject to the usual 6% diocesan tax. Our success proves once again that our generous support of the annual CSA is THE BEST WAY to financially support our parish. May God reward you for your generosity!

Your ongoing stewardship is the source of many blessings of time, talent, and treasure. I am most grateful for all you do to make our Saint Kenneth Community great!

ARCHDIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Because of the Stewards for Tomorrow Campaign and the establishment of an Archdiocesan Endowment, the Archdiocese of Detroit extends tuition assistance grants to Catholic families with children in grades 1-12 attending Catholic Schools. Saint Kenneth Parish will also give an additional Tuition Grant to registered parishioners' children who meet the eligibility guidelines established by the archdiocese or the individual school. Kindergarten children are NOT ELIGIBLE for Tuition Grant assistance.

Unlike previous years, there will no longer be a Parish Verification form needed at the time of application. The parish will instead be sent a list of all applicants who applied and the pastor must verify that the family is an active parishioner, or the application will not be processed. It is important that our parish is notified of any name differences (i.e. the student's name is different from the parent).

The application forms are available in the parish office or through the Catholic Grade or High School your children are attending. Only one application should be submitted per family, regardless of the number of schoolchildren. Applications must be submitted and received prior to April 12, 2010, but it is advisable to send them as soon as they are completed to avoid possible mailing and cut-off problems. Especially in these difficult economic times, I strongly urge all parents with children enrolled in a Catholic Grade or High School to take advantage of the opportunity that is present if you feel that your family might qualify for assistance.

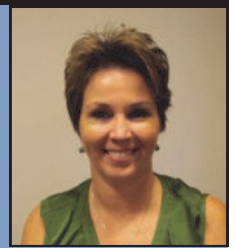

A Note from Gretchen...



When we think of Lent, we think of the words of John the Baptist: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near!" (Mt 3:2). Repent. What does that word mean? It means, first of all, to feel sorry for something. "I'm sorry I broke your truck, " we said (or were made to say!) to our little brother. "I'm sorry I got ketchup all over your blouse," we said to our teenage sister.

But repentance goes beyond expressing sorrow. My little brother, holding his truck in two pieces, has a right to ask, "What are you going to do about it?" So does my teenage sister, holding up her ruined blouse.

Repentance goes beyond being sorry. To repent means to turn from sin and dedicate oneself to changing one's life. Repentance, then, requires action. It demands changes. But we're not talking surface change – a new haircut, braces, losing ten pounds – or even twenty. No, we're talking serious change, deep change – a reshaping of our heart.

A friend of mine who happens to be a gifted musician, Gary Robertson, wrote his own responsorial psalm for Lenten liturgies. He wrote:

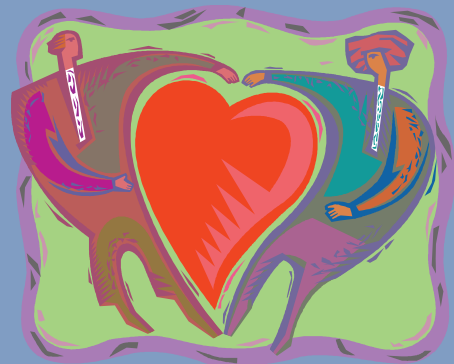
Reshape my heart, O Lord, my God
 Let you spirit dwell in me.

A good question to reflect upon during this season of Lent, then is this: **What reshaping do we need to do to allow God to dwell within us?** Gain patience? Self discipline? Increase prayer? Let go of Anger? Hurt? Guilt?

Reshaping our heart isn't something that happens instantly, overnight or even in a week. Fortunately, Lent offers us forty days to at least being the process.
